Masonic Fellowship is so important, the Grand Lodge’s 2025 Strategic Plan highlights the same under it’s “Theme 1: True Friendship” and the three goals thereof: “Goal 1: Masons understand and value true friendship.” “Goal 2: Masons build true friendships through excellent membership experiences.” “Goal 3: Masons are known for true friendship.”

Under Goal 1, our Grand Lodge opines: “Lodges should intentionally work toward building, promoting, and demonstrating friendship as a goal. When guests and prospects

are invited to lodge social activities, they will see Masonic friendships in action.”

Our Lodge fulfills this goal this month with both its Saturday morning breakfast on June 10, preceding the Open House/Information Meeting, AND its Golf Tournament the following Saturday, June 17. More about each of these later in this edition.

Under Goal 2, Grand Lodge suggests: “Lodges will plan activities that provide more opportunities for social and fraternal connections among members. Building even small traditions into the culture of the lodge that help members get to know each other can deepen the friendships between members.”

Our continuing monthly Fellowship no-host dinners at a restaurant are one such small tradition.

Under Goal 3, Grand Lodge remarks: “As Masons are increasingly seen as experts on friendship, lodges and Grand Lodge will develop public events and forums where outsiders can learn about friendship as a foundation of the organization.”

Our Open House/Information Meeting on June 10 will more than satisfy this goal. Interestingly, the Grand Lodge of Maine refers to such an event as a “Fellowship Night” ( <https://www.mainemason.org/resources/how-to-organize-a-fellowship-night/> ) although we meet in the daylight.

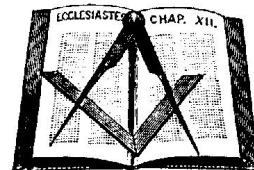

## A Mason's View of Fellowship

**E**ditor's Note: The following text is quoted from [http://phoenixmasonry.org/substance\\_of\\_fellowship.htm](http://phoenixmasonry.org/substance_of_fellowship.htm).

"[T]he fellowship which we address in the Masonic community can be the "gift" of attendance, interaction, listening without passing judgment, protecting and honoring the other person's dignity, support, advice, an idea, a compliment, a joke, a sincere question or even a tangible present. Or, perhaps, 'all-of-the-above.' Fellowship is that close-in charity, which we give to each other.

"So, what can the individual bring to that 'fellowship?' Particularly today, just your presence is truly a 'gift.' Bring a good attitude and a sense of humor; perhaps a joke or an interesting story. Bring your anticipation of - or creation of - a good time. Overcome any reservations or 'risks' as to whether or not you'll have a good time or learn (possibly receive) something of value.

"Equally important - bring another Brother, or a friend. Extend an invitation, secure a commitment; then be so caring as to remind that other person. Treasures shouldn't be kept as secrets....

"Fellowship is an action item; not just an option. "So," you ask, "what can I do?" Following is a short 'list:'

"A. Be aware of what is going on the immediate event is destined to be the primary source of conversation and interaction. If boredom should somehow prevail, you may be able to stimulate conversation, entertainment or information.

"B. Make it a point to interact; to get to know others and allow them to get to know you. Share information with others; name, family, job, travels, interests, hobbies even problems (and solutions.)

"C. Be alert and considerate as to the needs and wants of others. Your input may be required.

The infamous wall-flower may need to be drawn out. Possibly, he/she may need to be left alone.

"D. Acknowledge, recognize, applaud, congratulate, reward and facilitate others.

"E. Find, share or create humor and fun!"

## A Family Heirloom

I received a family heirloom, the Masonic ring pictured above, when I was raised a Master Mason in 1991. It belonged first to my mother's maternal grandfather, my great-grandfather, Bro. Isadore Freund, of Blessed Memory. He died in 1946 so I never knew him, but I have always felt a connection (maybe a fellowship of the ring) with him. I was named after him; my middle name is Ira.

I am very proud to wear his signet ring. You will see it on my right hand pinky finger from time to time, as I change it off with my father's ring, which I sometimes wear in his memory. The above ring is probably from about 1916, when my great-grandfather was raised a Master Mason in Hope Lodge No. 20, F.A.A.M., of the District of Columbia. That Lodge was chartered in 1867 and later subsumed into Wm. R. Singleton-Hope-Lebanon Lodge No. 7 which is still in existence. See, <https://www.singletonlodge.com/history-of-our-lodge.html>.

I also have a photocopy of my great-grandfather's Petition for the Degrees. He was initiated March 24, 1916, passed April 28, 1916, and raised May 31, 1916.

Bro. Isadore (aka "Buddy") was the earliest of many Masons of whom I became aware in my family. It is a family tradition, although not a prerequisite for anyone to become a Mason.

## Origins of the Masonic Ring

"Ever since the first modern masonic lodge was founded in the 1700s, masons have worn aprons, jewels and rings to signify their commitment to the craft. While there is no definitive 'first masonic ring,' it is well known that precious metals such as gold and silver have always been used in the manufacture of rings for freemasons. A masonic ring is typically worn by master masons. When a mason first begins his journey, there are three initial rankings within the organization. The three levels are entered apprentice, journeyman, and master. As a brother completes certain tasks and rituals, [he] will advance to the next level. The masonic ring is a symbol of where each member stands in their journey as a Freemason. While some masons choose to wear rings before they earn their 3rd degrees, we recommend that you wait until AFTER you have been raised to master mason. Wearing a mason ring is a great way to express your pride in belonging to such a heralded tradition.

"The rings are rooted in an old custom. Centuries ago, men wore personalized rings to be used as a seal on official documents. A notary would pour melted wax and the wearer would impress their ring face into the wax for an official signature to the document. The history of this ritual dates all the way back to the times of Pompey and Caesar. While the rings in masonic traditions are no longer used for creating seals, they are still a unique representation of the lodge, the member's rank and affiliations...."

## How to Wear a Masonic Ring

One rule of thumb in California of which this writer is aware is that, until one becomes a Master Mason, one does not wear a depiction of the Masonic emblem, i.e. the Square and Compasses, on a shirt, on a ring, or elsewhere. Once one becomes a Master Mason, many Masons obtain or are given their own ring. there are many views on how to wear a Masonic ring.

One writer says this

(<https://www.joyjewelers.com/jewelry-guide/proper-way-to-wear-masonic-jewelry.php>):

“Unmarried men are free to wear their ring on their wedding finger or the third ring finger on the opposing hand. [¶] Married men wear their rings on their third ring finger on the opposing hand. [¶] The pinky finger is mostly acceptable for wearing your ring and it becomes even more acceptable the further up in the tradition you advance. [¶] The symbol of the compass should be worn facing towards you only if you are a newer member because it shows you are taking the pledge to the tradition seriously. [¶] A more advanced or master member can turn their compass legs to face away from their body since they are a symbol of your commitment to outwardly reflect the fraternity.

Another writer says this (

“Ever since the day I became a Master Mason it was explained to me that my ring should

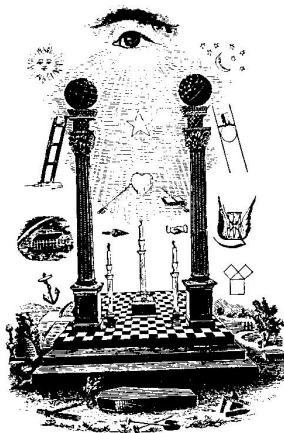

always face me until the day comes, that I've become a past master. The points of the compass always facing to the heart as that is the way the square and compass lie on the holy book facing you when taking obligation. This is a representation of the light of masonry shining upon you. So that said, when your ring points out that is a representation of you being the master of the Lodge or a past master as then you sit on the other side of the alter giving the knowledge/light. So to solve the dilemma of the ring when your hand is placed upon that square, compass and holy book when taking obligation, is the direction that ring should point until you make past master. May the light of [M]asonry continue to shine upon you.”

In either event, “Masonic jewelry is to be worn with pride and honor. It is best to check with your worshipful master to make sure you are upholding the requirements of how to wear your ring, jewel or watch according to your specific lodge.”

All of it promotes our Lodge and contributes to our Positive Awareness Campaign.

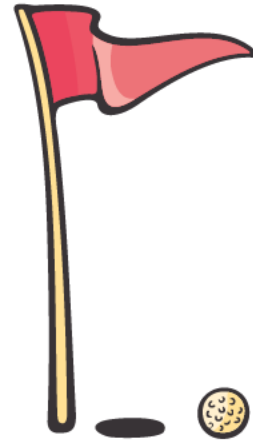

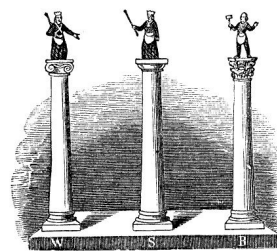
